

# 'Ilima Kula



Scientific Name: *Sida fallax*

Origin: Indigenous, Native to Hawai'i and other Pacific Islands

This 'ilima selection has an upright form and produces abundant yellow-orange 1-inch blossoms. The flowers are great for bees and other beneficial insects. It is normally grown in gritty, dry to medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun. Avoid heavy clay soils. 'Ilima, is the official flower of O'ahu - often used to make lei. It grows as prostrate ground-cover but also as a shrub. With excess shade or soil moisture, shrubs are vulnerable to rust or mold.
