

Tahitian Lime



Scientific Name: *Citrus latifolia*

Origin: Exotic, unknown

Also known as the Persian lime, this small, fragrant, ornamental citrus tree has a few thorns. It can be kept small by pruning and can provide light shade in a small yard. This tree produces large, tasty limes that rarely have seeds. The soil must be well drained. In low land subject to standing water, lime trees are best planted on elevated beds. Water 2 to 3 times per week until established. When planting outside, choose a location that will allow roots to spread.
