Scientific Name: *Thespesia Populnea*

Origin: Native to Tropics; Polynesian

Introduced "Canoe" Plant



It is a medium sized tree that has a pantropical distribution, found on coasts around the world. Probably an indigenous tree to Hawai'i, however, to date, there is no conclusive evidence to support milo as indigenous. Milo is easy to grow and care for. This is an excellent tree for coastal properties that battle with wind and salt spray. Milo is not a self-pruning tree. It recovers slowly from pruning; be selective about which parts and the amount to prune at any one time.
