Scientific Name: *Tamarindus indica*

Origin: Native to Tropical Africa



The tamarind tree produces pod-like fruit that contains a brown, edible pulp used in cuisines around the world. Tamarind is a slow-growing tree and very long-lived, in fact, it can survive for more than 300 years! Tamarind loves full sun and heat. Tamarind prefers deep loamy soil. It thrives in neutral, gritty, clay, even saline soil type. Soil should be well drained. Water saplings deeply when the first inch of soil is dry to the touch. Once established, tamarind trees don't need watering and can withstand periods of extreme drought conditions without experiencing adverse effects.
