

Scientific Name: Abutilon menziesi
Origin: Endemic to the Hawaiian Islands
(Oʻahu, Lanaʻi, Maui, Hawaiʻi)
Critically
Endangered

A spreading shrub that grows from 6 to 10 feet tall and about as wide is ok for small spaces. The roots have nitrogen fixing capabilities. Known from 10 sub-populations with a total population size of only 450-500 individuals. Early Hawaiians used the flowers in lei making. Heart shaped leaves and showy flowers that bloom 9 months out of the year make this endangered Hawaiian plant a special one to own.
